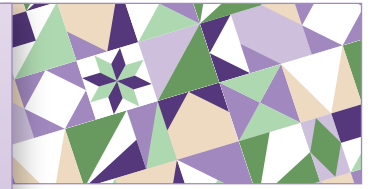

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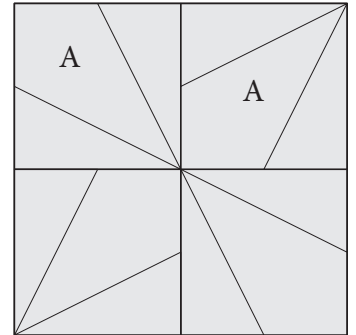

All the instructions you need to make the Corner Beam units required for this block came with your [Corner Beam®](#) tool. There's a chart, step by step graphics, and directions. Determine the finished size you are making and then work your way through the instructions.

This block is made using only one type of unit, the Corner Beam. This is a great time to play with color placement; depending where you place your colors you can get many different looking blocks. Use the line drawing to help with color placement. You can color the different sections of the units to come up with different options, then figure out which is your favorite look. When you sew your block together, pressing the seams open will help to reduce some of the bulk at middle intersection.
